In case of the death, resignation, or removal from office of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall become governor for the remainder of the term, which shall create a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor. However, for purposes of a primary election, a United States citizen must be at least eighteen years of age as of the next general election following the primary election.
